The ABC Program at CCFH is growing!

ABC (Attachment & Biobehavioral Catch-up) is an in-home program for young children and their caregivers. With new parent coaches on the team and the launch of the RISE Study out of UNC*, CCFH is actively seeking ABC referrals.

ABC at CCFH is open to:

- Families of children ages 6-48 months, English or Spanish-speaking

 As of August, 2024 we have IMMEDIATE OPENINGS for English-speaking families

 with children ages 18-48 months
- Families living in Durham County and the surrounding region.

~ There is NO COST or insurance requirement to participate in ABC~

Why ABC?

Over the course of ten weekly one-hour home visits, ABC strengthens parentchild relationships, enhances parenting skills, fosters child development, and creates positive changes that have been shown to last for years.

Who might benefit?

- **Infants and toddlers** whose crying, emotional outbursts, or tantrums can be hard to manage
- **Children** who have had an extended separation from caregivers or other highly stressful experiences in early childhood
- Parents who sometimes find it challenging to connect with their child
- Families who want to understand proven strategies to support their children's brain development
